

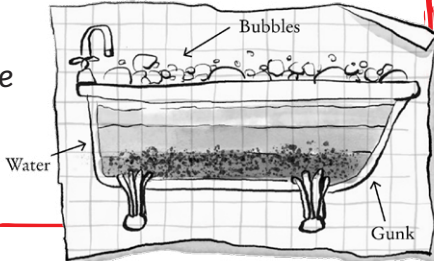
How to Run a Bath of Doom

What You Need:

a bathtub

sealed jars of every kind of gunk imaginable, such as:

- toenail grot
- boiled dandruff
- cheesy burps
- monkey sweat
- slug juice
- granny dribble
- badger snot
- water



Instructions

1. One by one, open each revolting jar of gunk.
2. Steadily, pour every last drop of gunk into the empty bathtub.
3. Wait patiently for the different types of gunk to ooze and gurgle together. You might need to swirl the concoction until it forms a disgusting layer on the bottom of the bathtub!
4. Slowly, turn on the taps to top up the bathtub with water until full, then turn them off again.
5. Create a thick, floating blanket of bubbles on the surface of the water to disguise the murky horrors beneath.

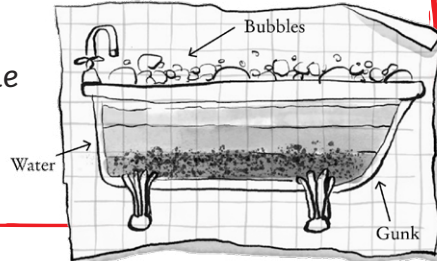
